9th Annual Geriatrics & Palliative Care Symposium Spotlight on Elder Abuse:

Now is the Time for Multidisciplinary Collaboration and Intervention Across the Care Continuum

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Statement of Need • Elder abuse is a national epidemic, requiring response from many systems. It cuts across all demographic groups and causes untold suffering. There are many types of elder abuse – and they can co-occur. Physical, sexual and emotional abuse, neglect, financial exploitation, confinement, abandonment. In the recent past, many professionals responded to elder abuse in silos, unable to access resources and knowledge to effectively assist the abused person. Many professionals did not identify elder abuse at all. Now, professionals from health care, mental health, guardianship, forensic accounting, law enforcement, social work, Adult Protective Services, victim advocacy, civil/legal, and financial institutions are systematically collaborating on elder abuse cases that otherwise would have gone untouched and unwittingly ignored. Elder abuse Enhanced Multidisciplinary Teams (EMDTs) are sweeping New York State, and offer a central point of response for professionals across the care continuum and beyond.

Target Audience • Physicians, fellows, residents, medical students, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, registered nurses, social workers, chaplains, advocates and other health care professionals.

Educational Objectives • It is intended that this NewYork-Presbyterian Queens CME activity will lead to improved patient care. At the conclusion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Discuss how to identify elder abuse and respond effectively.
- Analyze the mental and physical forensic indicators of elder abuse to screen potential victims.
- Identify ways to collaborate with interdisciplinary professionals on suspected elder abuse cases.
- Review community-based resources to help victims of elder abuse.

NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is located on the corner of Booth Memorial Avenue and Main Street in Flushing, NY.

From the Long Island Expressway: take the Main Street Exit (#23), travel north on Main Street to Booth Memorial Avenue. **From the Whitestone Bridge:** take the Van Wyck Expressway to the College Point Blvd. Exit; turn left on College Point Blvd. and right on Booth Memorial Avenue. Follow Booth Memorial Avenue to Main Street.

From the IRT Flushing Line #7: train to Main Street (last stop), then Q44 bus southbound on Main Street; stops opposite the Hospital. NewYork-Presbyterian Queens is located in a residential area with metered parking. Free lock-and-park spaces are available under the Van Wyck Expressway at College Point Blvd. and 58th Road. Shuttle buses to the Hospital run approximately every 10-15 minutes.

Limited paid parking is available in our Visitor Parking Lot located on Booth Memorial Avenue opposite the NewYork-Presbyterian Queens Emergency Room.
