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STATEMENT OF NEED

Benign and malignant pulmonary disease consists of many disorders that are common in our patient population today. There have been many recent advances in the diagnosis and treatment of these diseases. This 13th Annual NewYork-Presbyterian Queens Thoracic Symposium will review current trends, new technologies, and advances in the diagnosis and treatment of these disorders for primary care physicians and all others involved in the care of thoracic patients.
